ABOUT THE DOMAINE

Since their inaugural 2001 vintage of Anderson Valley Pinot Noir, Migration, part of Duckhorn Wines, has developed a refined and compelling style that balances vibrancy and finesse. In the years since, Migration has taken wing beyond its Anderson Valley origins exploring Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from California's finest cool-climate appellations, most notably Sonoma Coast. Today, guided by Winemaker Dana Epperson, Migration works with a handful of acclaimed growers to produce a small portfolio of sought-after Chardonnays and Pinot Noirs, including their flagship Sonoma Coast wines, and their coveted vineyard-designates. These sophisticated, Burgundian-varietal wines highlight lush fruit, bright acidity and balanced oak influence.

WINEMAKING

This wine has been 100% barrel fermented, and aged in New French oak. 75% Malolactic fermentation.

TASTING NOTES

This beautifully aromatic Chardonnay offers alluring aromas of Fuji apple, peach and lemon custard, as well as French oak-inspired hints of graham cracker, vanilla and sweet baking spices. On the palate, a bright, energetic acidity adds to the poise and purity of the citrus and orchard fruit flavours, while an undercurrent of creamy richness carries the wine to a long, supple finish.
