ABOUT THE DOMAINE

Since their inaugural 2001 vintage of Anderson Valley Pinot Noir, Migration, part of Duckhorn Wines, has developed a refined and compelling style that balances vibrancy and finesse. In the years since, Migration has taken wing beyond its Anderson Valley origins exploring Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from California's finest cool-climate appellations, most notably Sonoma Coast. Today, guided by Winemaker Dana Epperson, Migration works with a handful of acclaimed growers to produce a small portfolio of sought-after Chardonnays and Pinot Noirs, including their flagship Sonoma Coast wines, and their coveted vineyard-designates. These sophisticated, Burgundian-varietal wines highlight lush fruit, bright acidity and balanced oak influence.

WINEMAKING

10-14 days fermentation at 85°F. Small lot open top fermentations, 3-5 days of cold soak, daily punch downs. Aged 10 months in 100% French oak, 40% new and 60% neutral. The soil type is Goldridge sandy loam, Yolo series.

TASTING NOTES

Sourced from some of the finest cool-climate vineyards on the Sonoma Coast, this alluring Pinot Noir reveals inviting layers of ripe cherry, strawberry, rose petal, caraway and plum. On the palate it is lush, cohesive and impeccably balanced, with fine-grained tannins carrying the wine to a long, silky finish.
